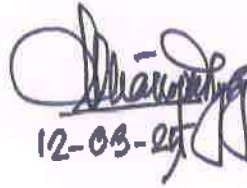

2. Point No.5: "As per the direction issued by the M/o Education, there should be reservation in all educational institutions, however, some universities are not following the guidelines for OBC reservation. A detailed report regarding Universities receiving grant-in-aid from Central/State Government and not following the reservation policy particularly OBC reservation be furnished. How many Universities have been exempted from the implementation of reservation criteria and under what rule and circumstances?"

Sub: Reasons for delay in submission of Annual Report for the year 2022-23 - reg.

Sir,

Inviting a reference to the email dated 27/02/2025 on the subject matter, the reasons for delay in submission of the Annual Report of the Institute for the year 2022-23 to MoE for laying in both houses of the Parliament are given below:-

1. After approval of the Annual accounts by BoG in the 118th meeting held on 08/06/2023, approved Annual Accounts was submitted to AG (Audit) on 31/07/2023. Accordingly, Audit Report was scheduled to be received by 30/09/2023. However, final SAR (English) was received on 29/11/2023 after compliance on the intermediary process of compliance of the Draft SAR as per requirement of the AG (Audit). There was further delay in receipt of the Hindi version of SAR, which was received in January 2024.
2. Since a regular meeting of the BoG could not be convened for approval of the Annual Report, approval of the BoG was taken by circulation on 24/01/2024 and Annual Report was submitted to MoE immediately after approval of the BoG.

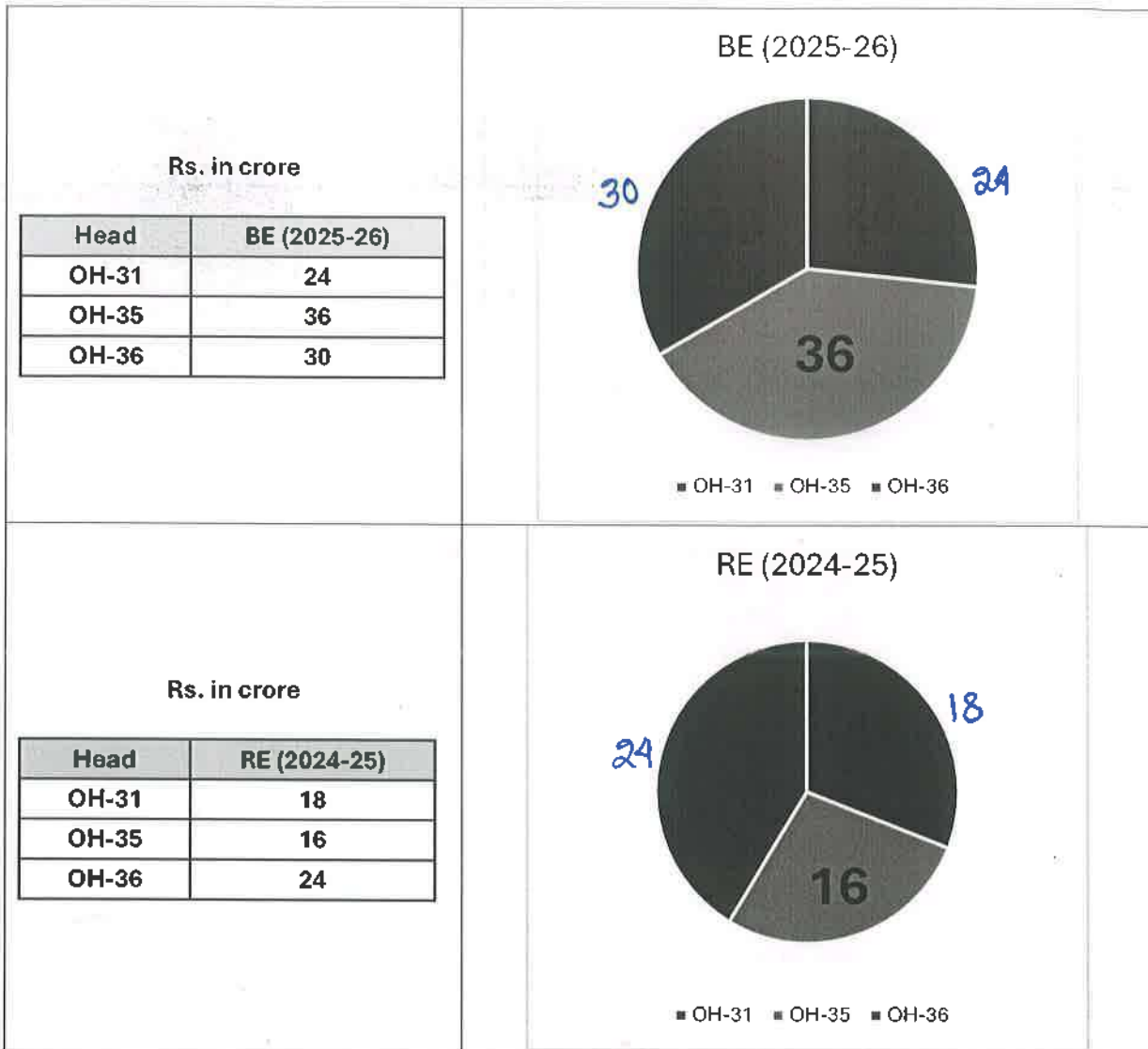

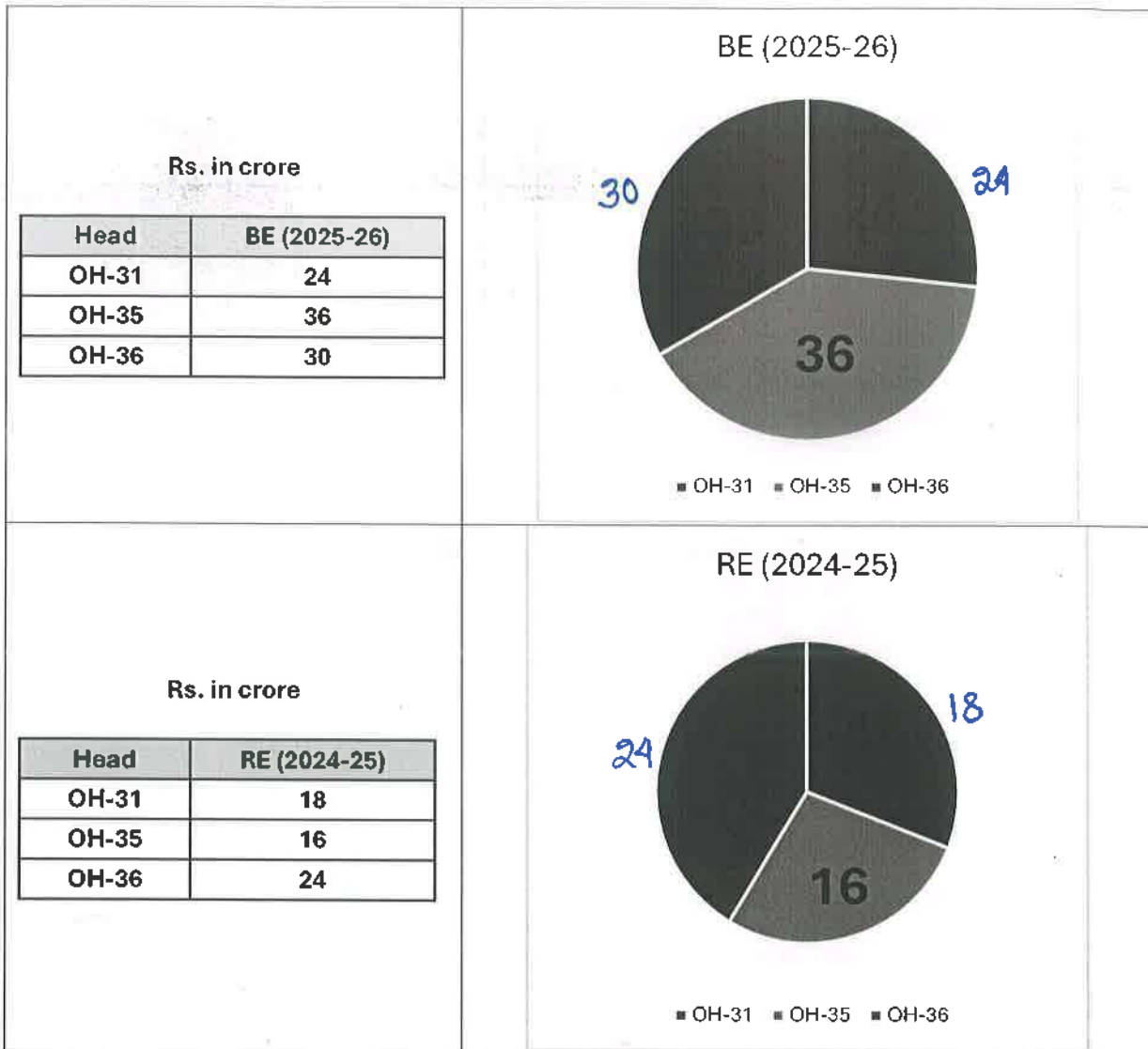

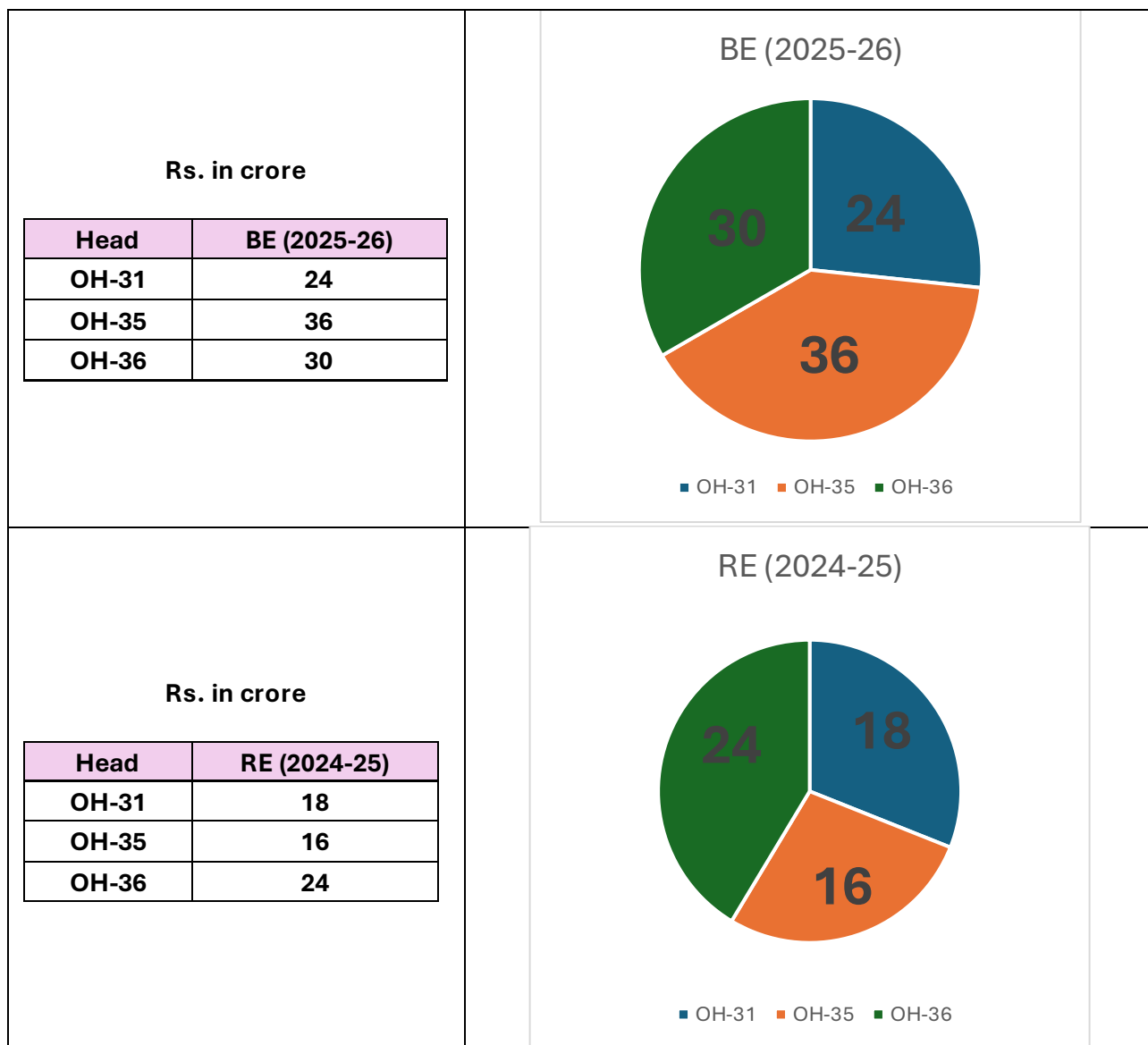

Review Statement on the Annual Report/Accounts for the year 2022-23

A. Background:

National Institute of Advanced Manufacturing Technology (NIAMT), Ranchi was established in the year 1966 as National Institute of Foundry and Forge Technology (NIFFT) by the Government of India in collaboration with UNDP-UNESCO. It is registered as a society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. The management of the Institute is vested with the Board of Governors with the Chairman as its apex and members drawn from All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE), Ministry of Education, Private and Public Enterprises, Technical and R & D institutions.

Ever since its inception, NIAMT (Formerly NIFFT) has been looked upon by the public sector and industry to provide qualified engineers and well trained specialists in the field of foundry technology, forge technology and other allied manufacturing areas. The institute has earned reputation as a leading institute for imparting technical education and organizing teaching and training programs in these engineering disciplines. The Institute has also been tenaciously and meticulously conducting, Industrial research, design and development in the relevant areas and providing consultancy and documentation services to the industries.

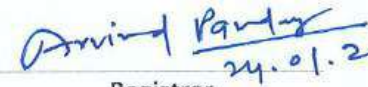

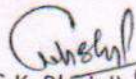

- iii. To avoid unnecessary delay, the material compiled at Bureau level as a whole may be furnished which must be approved by the Bureau Head. Forwarding letter, in this regard, should invariably mention that it has the approval of the Bureau Head concerned. Piecemeal/Section-wise inputs of Bureaus may be avoided.
- iv. The soft copy of the compiled material should be in MS Word (Times New Roman Font Size-12). The Bureaus may also ensure that the content is free from spelling errors etc.

- v. The Photographs, if any, along with its captions, relating to the important events/subject matter being provided in the material, should be in JPEG format and the occasion and the period/dates during which these photographs were taken must be clearly indicated.
- vi. The Bureaus are also requested to certify that the content of the soft copy is exactly as per approval of the concerned Bureau Head. If the material is not vetted by the concerned Bureau by the due date, the material would be presumed as vetted and, in this case, the onus of correctness of data/material lies with the concerned Bureau.
